PERFECT COMPLEMENT

“The homeowners wanted the primary bathroom to aesthetically mirror the bedroom,” Yellen explains. “So, the color palette is similar and there are repeated elements like brass fixtures as well as white, gray, and soft beige. It feels like an extension of the bedroom and not just another room.” The space was renovated to replace an oversized deck tub with a free-standing bathtub and a large shower. The room was reformatted to include a modern, private water closet, and his and her vanities as well.

“A primary bathroom is a good place to selectively incorporate fine fabrics,” Yellen advises. “The trim on this window shade is made of silk, for example. Whereas the living room has frequent touch points, that isn’t a concern in this bathroom.”
