In the master bedroom, the custom woodwork treatment on the walls and ceiling were originally painted in a busy combination of charcoal and white. Seeking a more soothing solution, Corley chose a light, neutral grasscloth wall-covering for the insides of the "boxes," and she painted the trim to match. The result is a calm, restful space to unwind.

The library already had impressive built-in bookcases and millwork trim, but the finishes were dated. Corley refinished the wood with a rich, dark stain, and she applied a light tan grasscloth wallpaper to the backs of the shelves for contrast so her clients' accessories would shine.

To see some of Corley's most dramatic changes, just look up. Nearly every room features an interesting ceiling treatment. Moldings, tray ceilings, and deeply coffered ceilings add a solid, hand-crafted architectural element to the home. One of the most dramatic changes is in the kitchen nook. Corley raised the formerly-flat ceiling to new heights, adding wood trim that accentuates the octagonal shape of the room.
